


# The Psychology of Vaccine Hesitancy


s COVID wears on we are experiencing a continuum of responses to vaccination that bear greater understanding. In this presentation we will discuss the history of vaccination and how vaccination works, the vaccine hesitancy spectrum of beliefs and behaviors, the role of social media in mis/ disinformation, and ways in which we can more effectively engage hesitant people in re-examining their reluctance.

He has been in the field for 50 years and is a consultant to health and human service agencies, law enforcement, and emergency services with an emphasis on crisis management and leadership.



# A PROGRESSIVE VISION FOR RELIGIOUS LIBERTY



Liz Reiner Platt will discuss the progressive vision for religious liberty rights formulated by legal scholars and theologians in a report titled "All Faiths and None: A Guide to Protecting Religious Liberty for Everyone." The report posits that policymakers have lost sight of the meaning and purpose of the First Amendment's guarantee of religious freedom, and offers guidance on what must be done to protect free exercise rights for

all, not merely a favored few. Its recommendations are organized around a set of guiding principles: religious liberty must be neutral; noncoercive; nondiscriminatory; not absolute; democratic; and pluralistic.
